


Bible Story based on 1 Samuel 18:1-4; 19:1-7; 20:1-42




David was brave. He wasn't a soldier, but he fought and killed Goliath.

Talk Time

LESSON FOCUS:

Be friends to others.

How was the other airl a friend to Emma? Talk about specific ways your child can be friends to others. And then pray for your friends.



Friend Frames

As a family, make picture frames to give to friends and to keep as a reminder to be friends to others.

You Will Need:

- Cardboard
- Construction paper, craft foam, scrapbook paper, or craft sticks
- Decorative supplies

- Glue
- Photos
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Scissors

To Make Your Friend Frames:

- 1. Have an adult cut a rectangle from cardboard and paper or foam. (You might want to use a 6x8 rectangle for a 4x6 picture.)
- 2. Glue the paper or foam to the cardboard.
- 3. Glue the picture in the middle of the paper or foam rectangle.
- 4. Decorate your frames with any supplies you have. If you didn't glue the picture down in step 3, make sure to leave room for a picture when you are decorating.
- 5. Fold a small piece of cardboard and tape it to the back of the frame for a support.
- 6. Give your frame to someone who has been a friend to you or display it to remember the friends God has given you.
