- 1. **Read 1:1-4:** Describe the "truth that leads to godliness."
 - a. 1:5-9: Paul emphasized that elders must be blameless in a number of ways. What are they?
 - b. Why is blamelessness so important for church leaders?
 - c. According to verse 16, how can you determine whether someone truly knows God?
- 2. **Read: 2:1-10:** How do we draw unbelievers (seekers) to the gospel and our Savior by the way we live? What does our lifestyle reflect about our beliefs?
- 3. **Read: 2:11-15:** What is our motivation for godly living?
- 4. **Read 3:1-8:** The world often says: Christians are hypocrites. Christians are live no different from the rest of us.
 - a. How is the person who does not know Christ described?
 - b. How can others know we are different as disciples of Jesus?
- 5. **Read 3:9-15:** After telling Titus to stress the truth of salvation (v. 8), Paul then told Titus to avoid other things; what errors did Paul say to avoid? (Give an example for each.)

<u>Prayer</u>: Lord, may you show me how my actions may reflect you (and not deny you). Show me any actions that deny you. (1:16). Lord, show me specific ways to make the gospel attractive to others and to follow through in helping others in the church this week. Thank you, God, for the saving grace of Jesus. May your Spirit help and empower me to live out your salvation in a way that attracts people to You. May my attitudes and actions bring unity, not divisiveness, to your church. Lord help me to live the truths I have learned from this letter.
